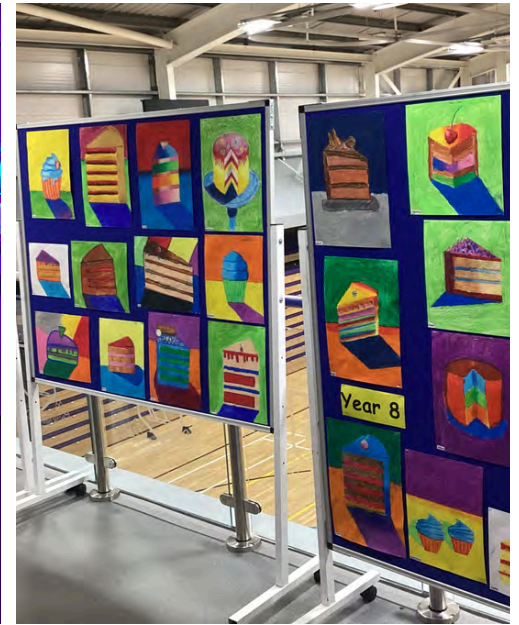
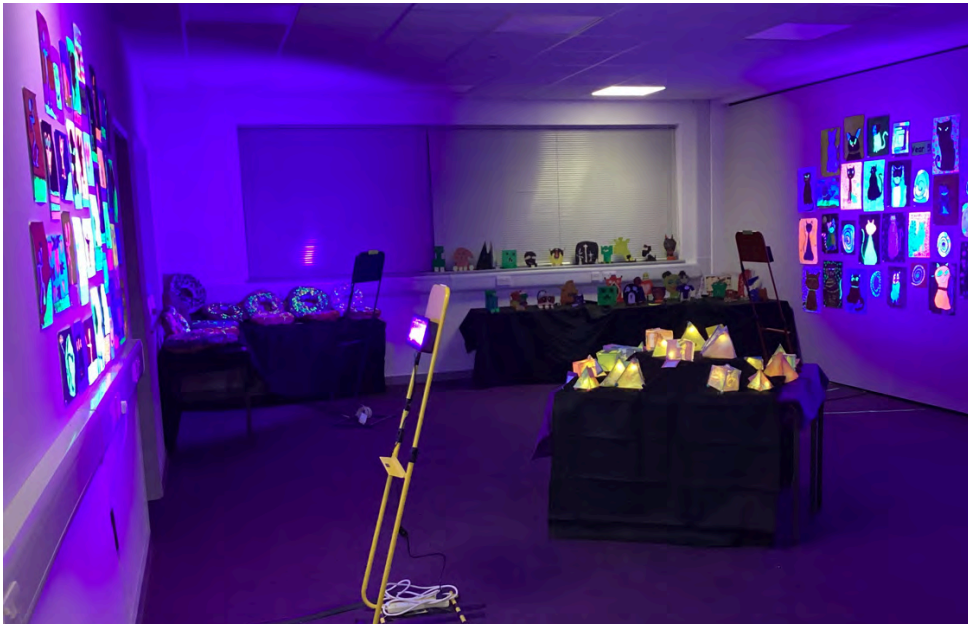

## Budding Year 5 & 6 scientists

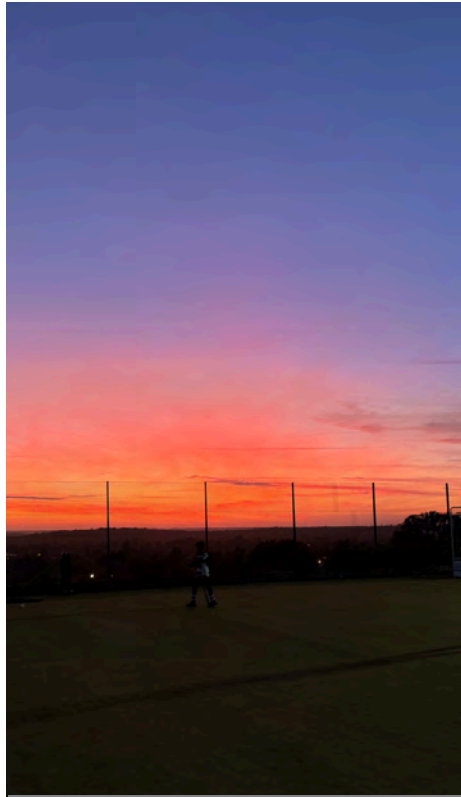

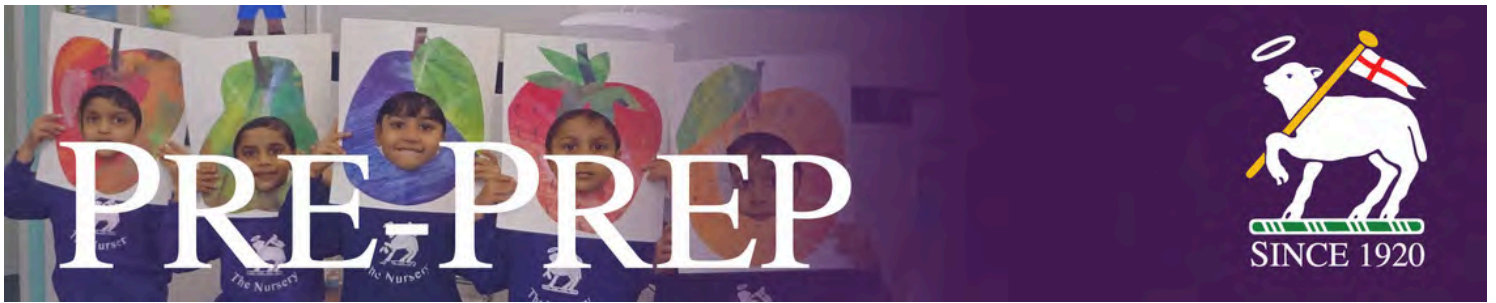

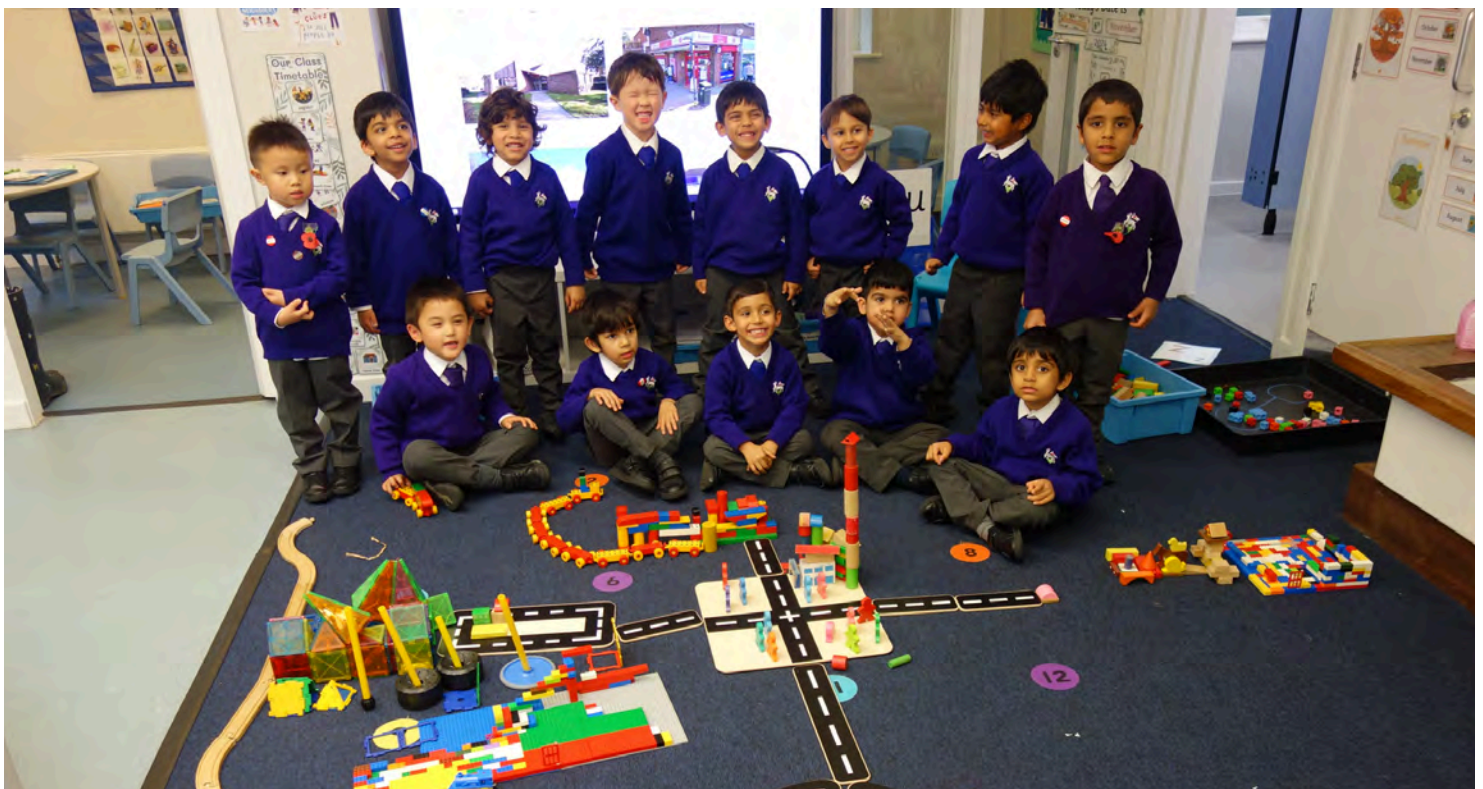
