Science Week - Change and Adapt






Technology, energy, evolution and more

Using quadrat the boys identified and logged the total different number of plants and animals in a set area and then compared different sites. They also enjoyed the peace and quiet in the beautiful gardens, which were blooming into Spring. They were impressed by the historic greenhouses with their ancient and rare tropical plants. We also had a chance to walk the exhilarating tree tops walkway and experience being chased by very territorial geese!






Role play in English










Mass-ive fun this week in Nursery!

The boys have been very busy creating wonderful work for our annual House Art Competition.
















Testing times in the workshop
