

Mr Hodes spoke to Years 6 to 8 about what Holocaust Memorial Day means to him and discussed some of his own family history, particularly the stories of his great-great uncles. We heard about Jakob, who survived Auschwitz and Bergen Belsen, and his brother Robert, who was shot by the Nazis in Krakow. It was powerful for the boys to hear such a personal connection to the Holocaust. Mr Hodes finished with these words: "Each of us has the power to stand against hatred, prejudice, and injustice in our everyday lives. By educating ourselves and speaking out when we see discrimination, we honour the memory of those who suffered and ensure that their stories are not forgotten."








